Differing Effects of Alcohol

2.	When the group entered the party, David headed right for the food. The other three said they weren't hungry yet and headed for the bar. How will David's eating affect his alcohol tolerance?
3.	Michael's allergies have been giving him a lot of trouble lately. He decides to take a dose of his allergy medicine just before he goes to the party to make sure he feels his best. Was this a wise decision? Why or why not?
