- Herby's popularity -89%
- Human Cost -148 killed, 458 wounded
- Economic Cost -\$7 billion (Total \$61 billion)
- Oil prices down
- War Blueprint: Powell Doctrine

- A clear risk to national security exists

- Clear exit strategy

 War




UN Resolution 687 Must fully disclose all chemical, biological, and nuclear weapons.




 Destroyed over 100 Scuds, 70 tons of nerve gas and 400 tons of mustard gas.






Problem: US Uncovered evidence of Assassination **Attempts** against Herby



Operation Bushwhacker June 26, 1993

16 of 23 cruise missiles hit targets in Baghdad



SUCCESS:

No more assassination attempts against US Presidents by Hussein

Problem: 40,000 Iraqi troops on northern border of **No Fly Zones**



Operation Desert Strike September 3, 1996

27 cruise missiles fired -UN Security Council approved



SUCCESS:

Iraqi Army withdrew from No Fly Zone Border

Weapons Inspectors Timeline

1997

- November 13 Iraq kicked OUT inspectors
- November 19 Iraq permitted inspectors to RETURN

1998

- January 13 Iraq BARRED inspectors from sites
- February 23 Through UN, Iraq agreed to inspections
- October 31 Iraq suspended cooperation

Iraq Liberation Act

October 31, 1998

- supported regime change in Iraq
- supported transition to democracy



Weapons Inspectors Timeline

1997

- November 13 Iraq kicked OUT inspectors
- November 19 Iraq permitted inspectors to RETURN

1998

- January 13 Iraq BARRED inspectors from sites
- February 23 Through UN, Iraq agreed to inspections
- October 31 Iraq suspended cooperation
- November 15 Iraq permitted inspections
- December 15 UN Inspector: Iraq not complying with inspections

Operation Desert Fox December 16 – 19, 1998

650 sorties and over 400 cruise missiles

SUCCESS

 over 100 targets destroyed set back
 programs a year



FAILURE

 Hussein still did not let UN weapons inspectors
 back into Iraq
