- 2. A complete listing of <u>important legislation</u> passed by the US Congress or about the US within each unit. There should be an explanation as to the importance of each act.
- 3. A complete listing of <u>foreign involvements/wars/treaties</u> that we were involved within each unit. A short explanation of all is required.
- 4. A complete listing and defining of all important <u>vocabulary terms</u> that may be found within the unit.
- 5. <u>20 AP level Multiple Choice questions</u> must be created with <u>5 possible answers each</u> that summarize the unit. These must be of your own creation.
- 6. Two possible essay topics are to be created using what was gleaned from the Unit.
