Guest Speakers

Denise Zallow – 5th grade presentation

- The Disney Planet Challenge is being conducted by the students in 5C. Eight students came to present their information at the meeting
- Disney's Planet Challenge (DPC) is a project-based learning environmental competition for classrooms across the United States. DPC teaches kids about science and conservation while empowering them to make a positive impact on their communities and planet. Disney's Planet Challenge is by Disney's Friends for Change.
- This year's class is focused on the Emerald Ash Borer, a beetle native to Asia that was accidentally introduced to Marshall Township through a shipping crate brought in containing building materials. The Emerald Ash Borer lays eggs in the Ash trees and eventually kills it and others nearby. The top of the tree dies first and the borer creates an "S" pattern in the bark. The bark eventually falls off and the tree is left with holes in the trunk.
- The students in 5C partnered with Marshall Township to replace trees that were dying because of the emerald ash borer. They raised money (\$265) and planted several new trees to improve Knob Hill Park. They planted Hickory trees which are native to Pennsylvania and have no known predators to attack it.
- On February 2nd from 6:30 8:30 pm, there is a meeting at the Marshall Township Community Center to inform the community about the problem the Emerald Ash has caused and what they can do to stop it from spreading. Everyone is encouraged to attend. There will be speakers from Penn State and Phil Gruszka, Director of Pittsburgh Parks Management and Maintenance.

Beth Ludwig – NA Foundation
