Vocabulary/Definitions

Synchronous

A time when the students meet with the teacher live on Blackboard Collaborate or Google Meets.

Asynchronous

A time when the students work independently on assignments given by the teacher via Blackboard.

DEFINITION :



An instructional setting in which a group of participants is engaged in learning in real-time, allowing for immediate feedback

- Interaction with students in the moment
- Exchange of knowledge & experience between learners in real-time
- Immediate feedback from the instructor

SYNCHRONOUS INSTRUCTION

- In-Person Instruction
- Blackboard Collaborate Meetings
- Live-Streaming
- Small group discussions
- Posting to a chat feature in Collaborate (responses are in real-time)

- Watching a teacher-created pre-recorded instructional video
- Students completing an online assignment at their own pace
- Posting to a discussion board IF responses are NOT in real-time



EXAMPLES:

DEFINITION:

An instructional setting in which a group of participants is NOT engaged in learning in process at the same time or in the same location



- Students can go at their own pace
- Learners can review materials as many times as necessary
- Allows for flexible scheduling

ASYNCHRONOUS INSTRUCTION

- Pre-recorded video lessons
- Self-paced digital assignments
- Blackboard learning tasks
- Posting on Discussion Board
- Collaborative Note-Taking

- Video conferencing
- In-person instruction
- Live webinar
- Phone conversation

Attendance

- Daily attendance will be recorded each day during homeroom. All students are expected to attend homeroom within BlackBoard Collaborate synchronously every school day.
- Homeroom occurs daily 8:10 AM- 8:26 AM and students are expected to be in Blackboard Collaborate for their homeroom each day .
- Homeroom teachers will designate each student's presence or absence in Tyler for school record. If your child is absent, you will need to submit an excuse electronically to the school.



Grading

FORMATIVE

Grades 6-12 = 30% weight of overall grade

Definition:

Monitor student learning throughout instruction to improve student achievement of learning objectives and inform teacher instructional decision-making

SUMMATIVE

Grades 6-12 = 70% weight of overall grade

Definition:

Evaluate student learning, knowledge, proficiency, or success at the conclusion of an instructional period by comparing it to a standard or benchmark

DEFINITION:



Monitor student learning throughout instruction to improve student achievement of learning objectives and inform teacher instructional decision-making

- Informs teacher instructional decisions to meet student needs related to standards proficiency
- Provides data to flexibly group students
- Supports student enrichment, reinforcement, and remediation

FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT

- Entrance and Exit tickets
- Anecdotal Notes during lesson and/or engagement/participatory protocols
- Classroom Poll or Discussion
- Concept Mapping
- First/Rough draft of essay

- End of unit assessment
- Standardized Tests
- Oral report
- Chapter test
- Final project with rubric for grading

DEFINITION :



Evaluate student learning, knowledge, proficiency, or success at the conclusion of an instructional period by comparing it to a standard or benchmark

- Communicates student achievement of learning objectives
- Demonstrates student knowledge and/or skill acquisition
- Provides learning community with products of student learning

SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT

- Midterm or final exam
- End of unit project
- Chapter test
- Standardized assessments
- Final published copy of essay

- Drawing a concept map
- Classroom Poll
- Entrance and Exit Tickets
- Anecdotal Notes during lesson and/or engagement/participatory protocols



EXAMPLES:

Curriculum

- All NACA courses will be a blend of Edgenuity and North Allegheny Curriculum. Blackboard and Edgenuity will be used as the LMS.
- Recorded lessons
 - All direct instruction synchronous lessons will be recorded.
 - If a student is absent from school on a day when synchronous content is being delivered, they can refer to the video from the session.
 - Synchronous lesson videos will be posted to the teacher's Blackboard page at the end of each day.
- Teacher availability
 - Teachers are available for questions via email and during asynchronous learning times.

Materials, Books, and Consumables

- Most of the textbooks and materials for NACA classes will be virtual
- However, there are will be times throughout the year when materials will be needed for coursework to be completed. A schedule of time, date, and location of pick up will be provided when necessary.
- The first scheduled NACA material pick up date is September 16th. Details will be forthcoming regarding time and location.
