

IMS iPad Usage & Guidelines

Congratulations! This is a very exciting time for you and the district. The iPads are a wonderful resource that will provide meaningful learning opportunities throughout the year. With this new opportunity comes a significant amount of responsibility as well. It is important to remember that the iPads are an educational tool like your textbook. They may or may not be used every day in every class. Their purpose is to supplement our existing curriculum. In order for this year to be successful, we need to have a few guidelines in place. Please review the items below carefully.

Reminders

- Take the device home and charge it every night.
- Avoid extreme temperatures.
- You can access Wifi at school and at home.
- The Internet is filtered at school and at home.
- Your iPad must be carried in the district approved case.
- The App Store, iTunes, and Apple Music have been restricted from the device.

Rules and Responsibilities at School

- You are permitted to use the iPad during homeroom, class time, or activity periods when instructed by the teacher. Using the device at inappropriate times is subject to discipline.
- You are permitted to take pictures and videos or surf the web when teachers assign classwork or projects using these tools.
 - Using the device for Face Timing, Videotaping, or taking pictures, without being told to do so by a teacher, is a violation of the User Agreement and subject to discipline.
- You should treat the device like your textbook, binder, etc. It should travel with you to every class. Forgetting the device may result in a consequence as determined by the teacher.
- You may purchase a stylus or earbuds (only) to use with the device.
- Assigned classwork must be completed first before you use your iPad. During activity periods, you should work on homework or read quietly for 30 minutes without using the iPad. The last 10 minutes may be reserved for iPad use as determined by the teacher.
 - If a teacher is requiring the use of the device for an assignment, then you should discuss this with your homeroom teacher.
