"When a school district adopts [MTSS], teachers are no longer expected to meet the diverse needs of students alone, but rather to do so in collaboration with teams of educators." *Broxterman and Whalen, 2013.* 

WIN Is not... Is... targeted to a specific skill. used to introduce new CORE material. provided to small groups of students with whole-group, one-size-fits-all instruction. similar learning needs. coupled with performance feedback and a test-prep or test-taking period. opportunities for repeated practice. fluid and flexible, based on students' needs. always instructing the same group throughout the year. structured in tiers so that students can receive an opportunity for make-up work. what they need with fidelity. grouping students appropriately within a usually self-contained. grade-level and switching across a gradelevel. planning for multiple groups. working smarter, not harder to plan for one group. about YOUR kids. It's about OUR kids. collaborative across grade levels and teams.
