targeted to a specific skill.	used to introduce new CORE material.
provided to small groups of students with similar learning needs.	whole-group, one-size-fits-all instruction.
coupled with performance feedback and opportunities for repeated practice.	a test-prep or test-taking period.
fluid and flexible, based on students' needs.	always instructing the same group throughout the year.
structured in tiers so that students can receive what they need with fidelity.	an opportunity for make-up work.
grouping students appropriately within a grade-level and switching across a grade-level.	usually self-contained.
working smarter, not harder to plan for one group.	planning for multiple groups.
collaborative across grade levels and teams.	about <i>YOUR</i> kids. It's about <i>OUR</i> kids.
