

Options for Potential College Credit in this Course

There are two pathways available for interested students to potentially earn college credit through this course.

1. Successful Completion of the AP Exam
2. College in High School Credit through LaRoche University

Students are welcome to either choose one of these two options, choose both options, or choose not to participate in either option. The table below highlights some important differences between the two options.

How Credit is Potentially earned	Different colleges accept different scores on the AP Exam for credit. Certain schools do not offer credit for AP Exams. Below are some general guidelines, but this will vary from one situation to another. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who score a 5 will qualify for credit in most circumstances • Students who score a 4 will qualify in many circumstances • Students who score a 3 may qualify in some circumstances. 	Students will receive the same letter grade through LaRoche as they receive on their NA transcript. They will have access to a LaRoche transcript to be able to potentially transfer these credits to their future college or university. The transferability of the credits will depend on your child's future college or university's willingness to transfer in credits from LaRoche.
How Many Credits Can Be Earned? What Do these Credits Offer?	This will vary from one college to another and may differ based on the score earned on the AP Exam. Successful completion of the AP Exam in many cases will allow students to “test out” of introductory classes covered by the AP Curriculum.	Students will earn credits through LaRoche. Classes are worth 3 credits, with a short list of exceptions: 4 credit courses: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Computer Science, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, AP Physics 1 & 2 If a student enrolls at LaRoche as an undergraduate, these classes will transfer directly. If a student attends a different college, how the credits will transfer will vary from school to school and may be dependent on a student's major and how the coursework aligns with that major. Some possible outcomes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Credits accepted as “elective” credits • Credits accepted in place of required courses
