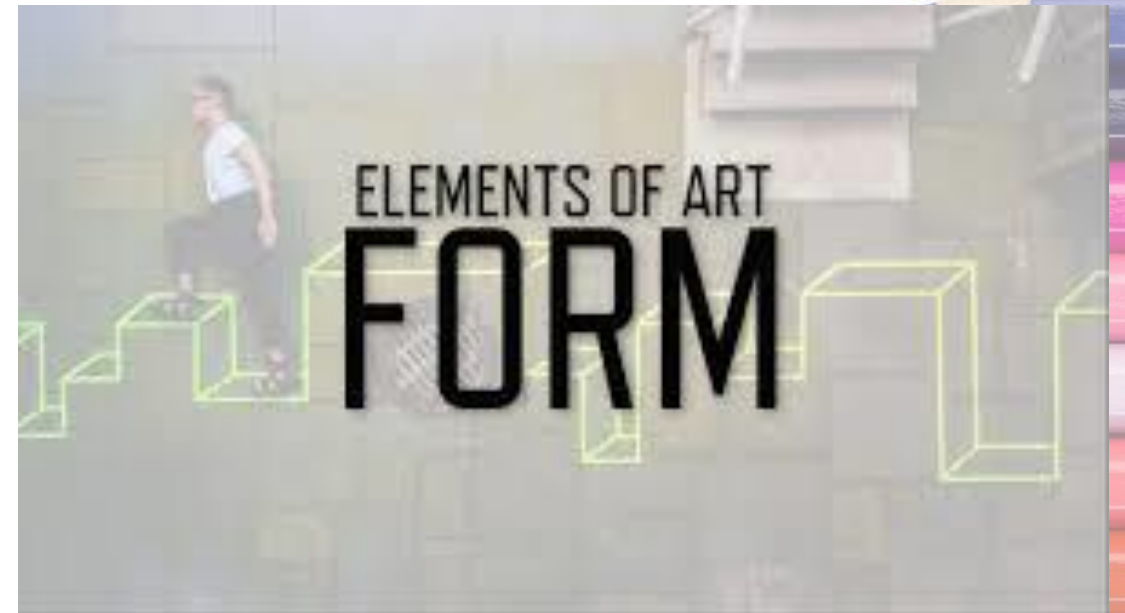
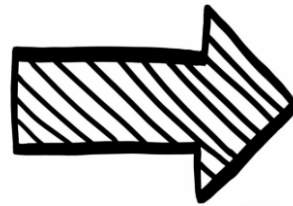

You're making a **SCULPTURE** this week for your art activity, but first, let's learn about something called **FORM!**



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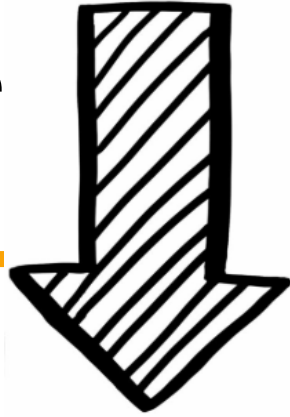

Remember from last week... The **ELEMENTS** of art are the “building blocks” of art, kind of like the alphabet is to creating words. We use these elements to **create** and **describe** works of art.

## So Let's Recap from the VIDEO...

- **Form** is one of the 7 Art Elements
  - Line, Form, Shape, Color, Texture, Value, and Space
- **Form** refers to objects that are **3-dimensional** or have length, width and height.
- If an artwork or object “looks” 3-dimensional, but is flat, it has an **illusion of form**.

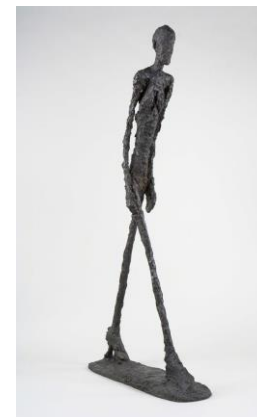

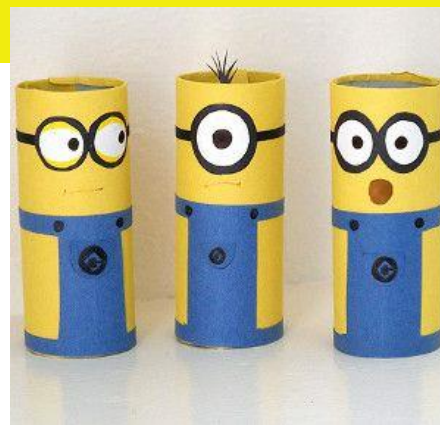
