

Remember from last week... The **ELEMENTS** of art are the "building blocks" of art, kind of like the alphabet is to creating words. We use these elements to **create** and **describe** works of art.

 Lots of artists use form to create artwork.

So Let's Recap from the VIDEO...

- Form is one of the 7 Art Elements
 - Line, <u>Form</u>, Shape, Color, Texture, Value, and Space
- Form refers to objects that are 3-dimensional or have length, width and height.
- If an artwork or object "looks" 3-dimensional, but is flat, it has an **illusion of form**.




