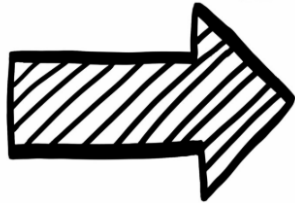
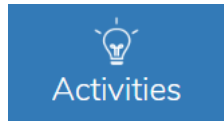

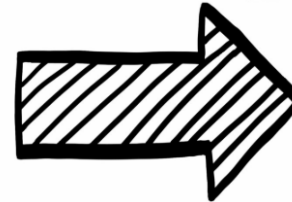

*Line, Form, Shape, Color, Texture, Value, and Space*

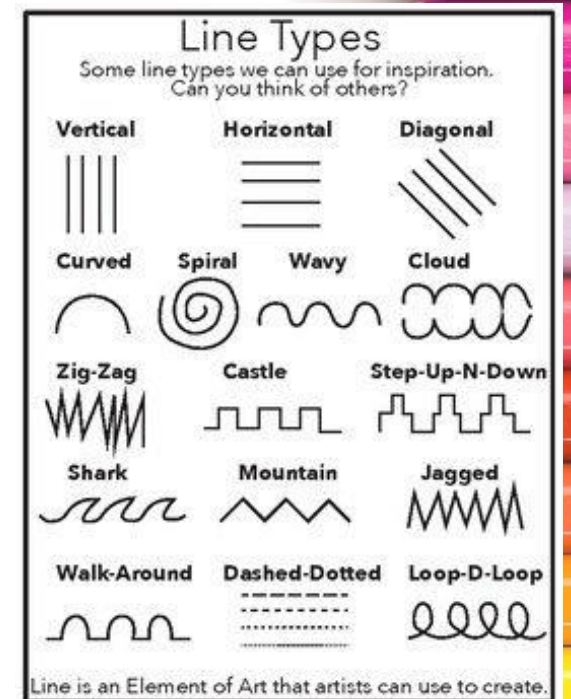
The **ELEMENTS** of art are the “building blocks” of art. We use these to **describe** works of art.

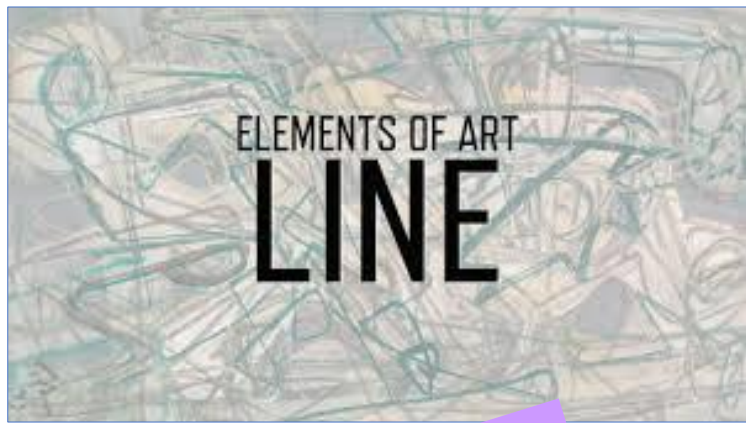
Line – a path created by a moving point, mark, or object

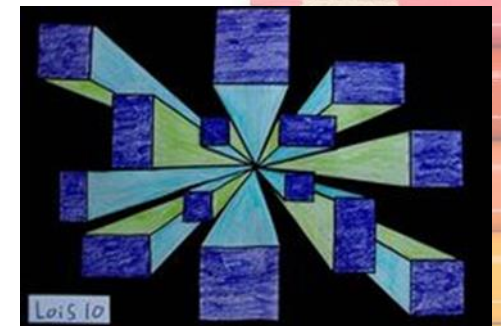

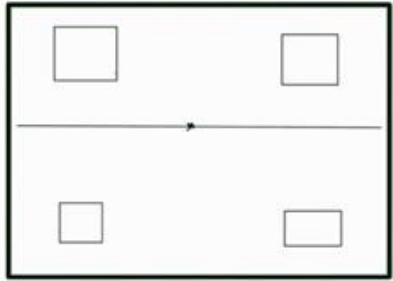

\*You can make your boxes floating or connected to the vanishing point!

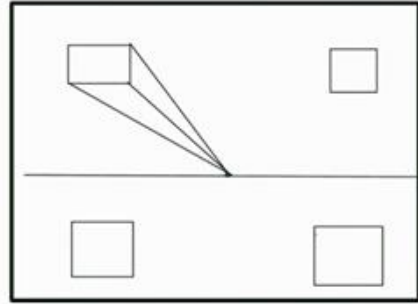




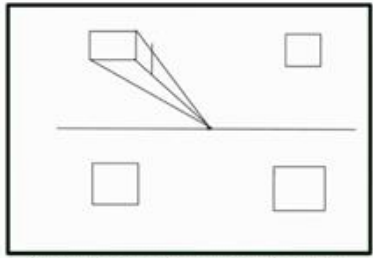
# Now it's your turn! Create your own One Point Perspective Drawing!



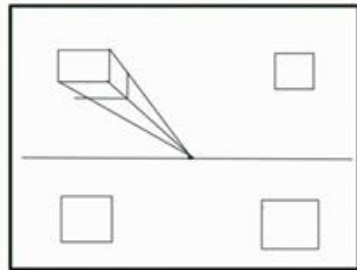
Step 1) Create horizon line, mark vanishing point and draw four boxes as pictured here.  
All lines must be drawn using a ruler.



Step 2) use a ruler to draw straight lines from the vanishing point to the three corners that are nearest to the vanishing point.

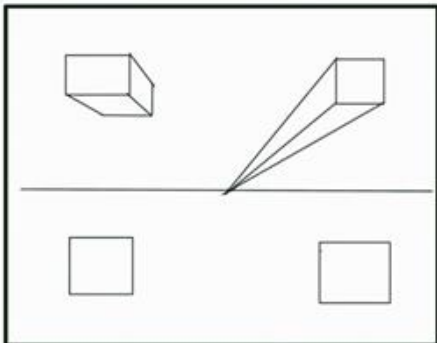


Step 3) The back part of the form must be parallel to the front.

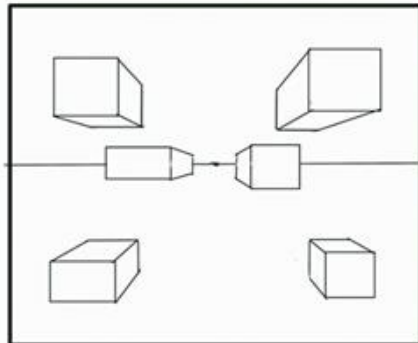


Step 4) Pictured above, I have drawn the back part of the bottom and side of the form  
The side is vertical and the bottom is horizontal.

Check them because if they aren't parallel with the front of the shape you will have to erase and redo them



Step 5) Erase the extra lines all the way to the vanishing point.  
Repeat steps 1-4 for the other three rectangles.



you can only see two sides of the boxes that sit directly on the horizon line.  
You cannot see the top or bottom because the horizon line is at the same level as your eyes

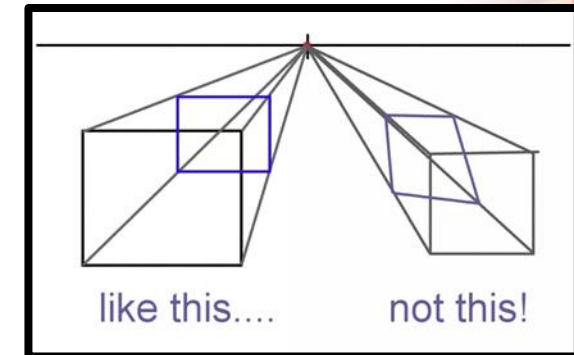
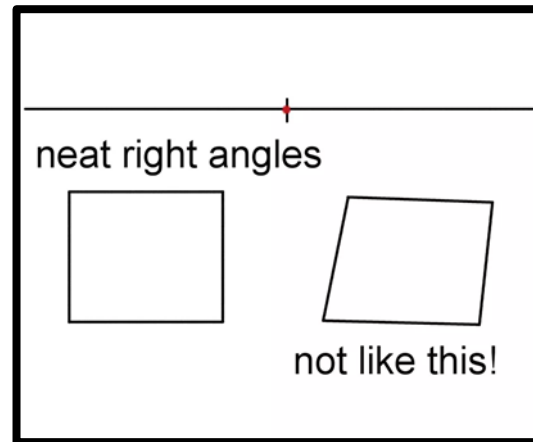
You will need a pencil, ruler or straight edge, and an eraser.

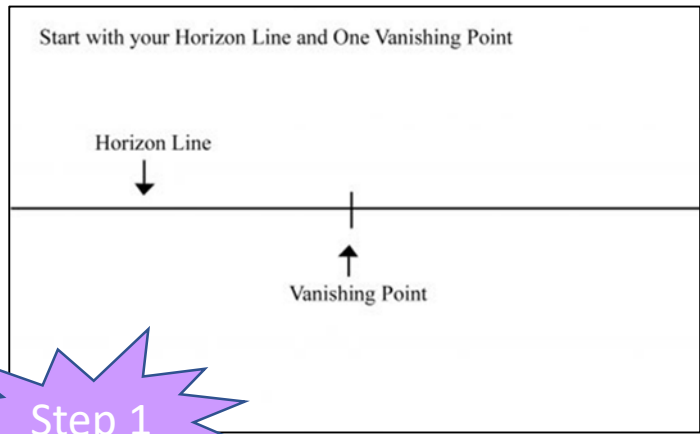
Helpful Hints:

Remember start with a horizon line and add a vanishing point.

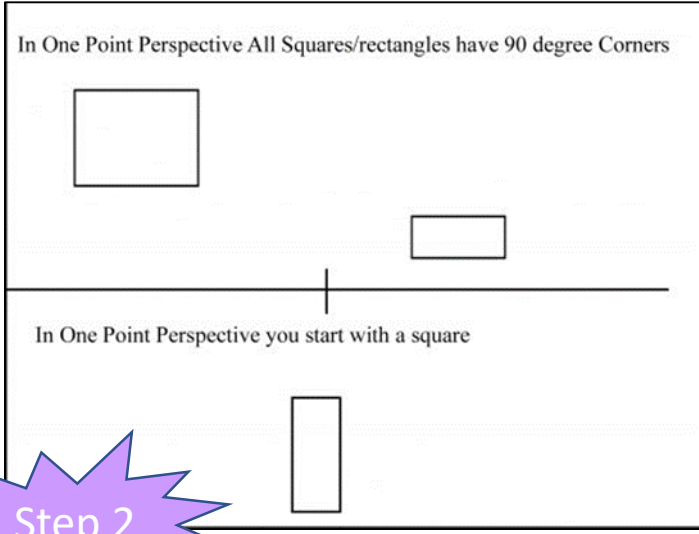
Draw a line from all corners to the vanishing point.

Draw straight, horizontal, and parallel lines.

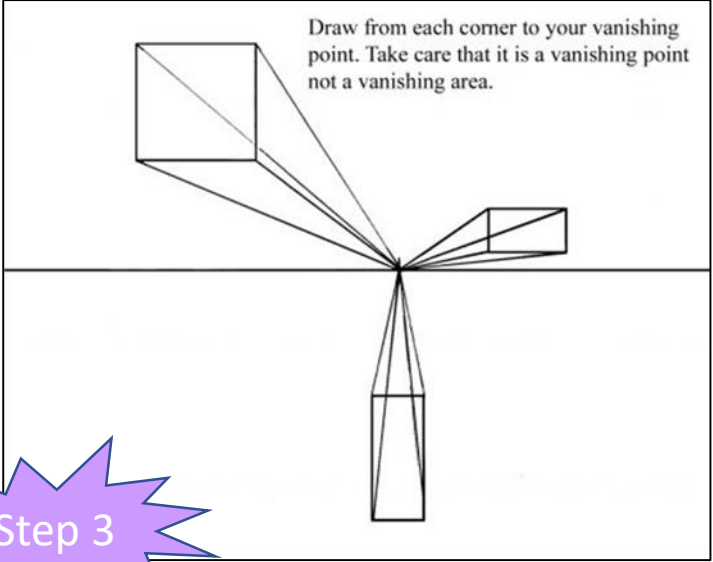

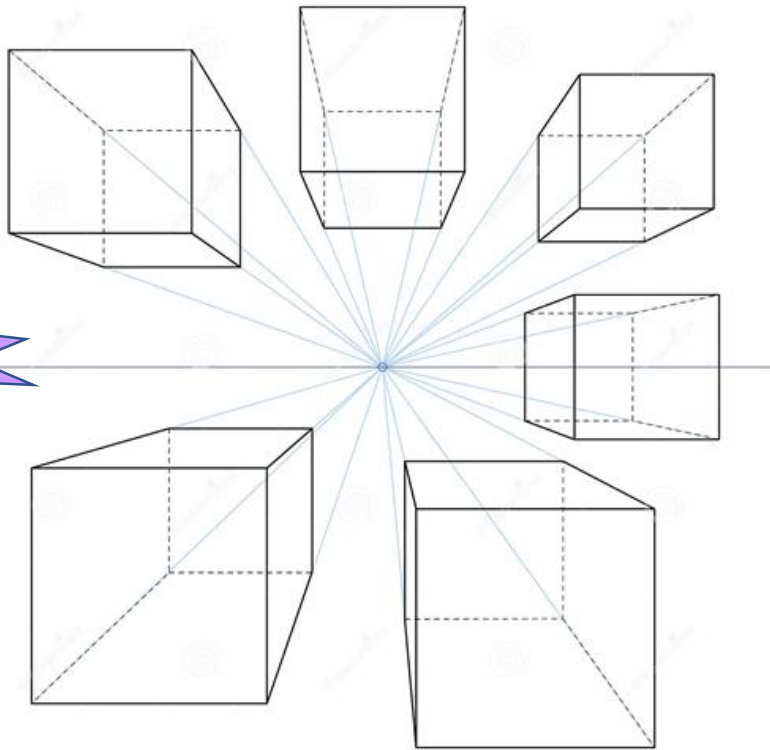
