6. District Committee Reports:

a. SPLC

North Allegheny School District is considering changes to help reduce student stress. Two issues that were discussed were to change or eliminate "grade weighting" for honors classes in the high school and altering the start times for school.

The issue which has the greater impact on Hosack students immediately is changing the start times for the school day. Research has shown that high school students do much better if they do not start school before 8:30. Three proposals were put forth: Flipping the high school and elementary school start time, combining the middle school and high school start time or moving all the start times back by 1 hour. The Superintendent's office will be holding public meeting to discuss the issue in November. The time frame for implementing any changes would be for the 2018-2019 school year.
