Grammar

Adjectives, Articles, and Verbs

Define the words adjective.

A word that describes a person, place, or thing.

Define the word article.

A word that tells which one about nouns.

Define the word verb.

A word that tells what something or someone does.

- Remember that an adjective can be used to compare things.
- The articles a and an must go with singular nouns.
- A verb must agree in number with its subject; a singular subject takes a singular verb form, and a plural or compound subject takes a plural verb form.

Grammar

Review: Adjectives, Articles, and Verbs

The cat ran fast than the dog.
(The cat ran faster than the dog.)

Some students walks to school.
(Some students walk to school.)

- Notice how in the first sentence the word faster should be used to compare the cat and the dog.
- In the second sentence, students is a plural noun so it receives a plural verb, walk.
