Robust Vocabulary

Distinct

When there are several similar but separate objects, they are said to be distinct.

I made three <u>distinct</u> piles of marbles.



Slightly When something happens slightly, you barely tell it happened.


Mom <u>slightly</u> moved the car mirror to see the road.



Infinite

When there is so much of something that it cannot be measured, its size is infinite.

The amount of numbers that exist is <u>infinite</u>.



Expansive

Something that is expansive covers a lot of space.

The Pacific Ocean is an <u>expansive</u> body of water.



Rotate

Something that rotates spins like a top.

The globe <u>rotates</u> so you can see all around the world.



Steady

A light that is steady always looks the same and does not change or go out.

I was able to walk on the beam because my feet were <u>steady</u>.



Reflect

When something reflects, light bounces off its surface instead of passing through it.

The water <u>reflects</u> the beautiful flower.



Surface

The surface of something is the top part of it.

The drop of water made ripples across the <u>surface</u>.



Evidence

Evidence is proof of what has happened.

The cat prints were evidence that she had spilled the ink.



Appear How something appears is the way it looks or seems to be.

Our dog seems to <u>appear</u> every night around supper time.
