When something happens slightly, you barely tell it happened.

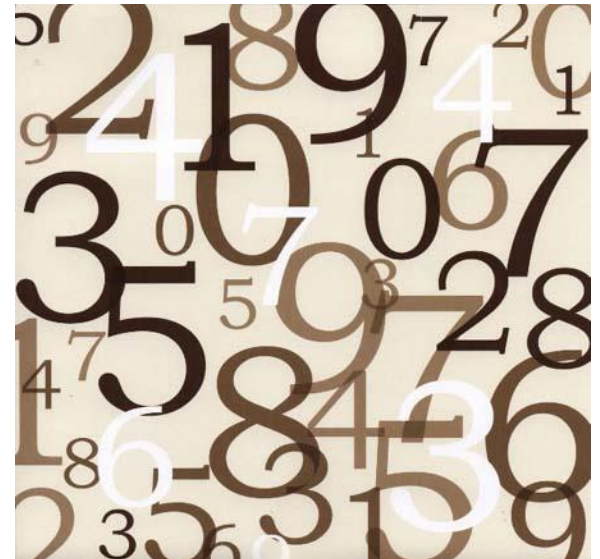
Mom slightly moved the car mirror to see the road.

A light that is steady always looks the same and does not change or go out.

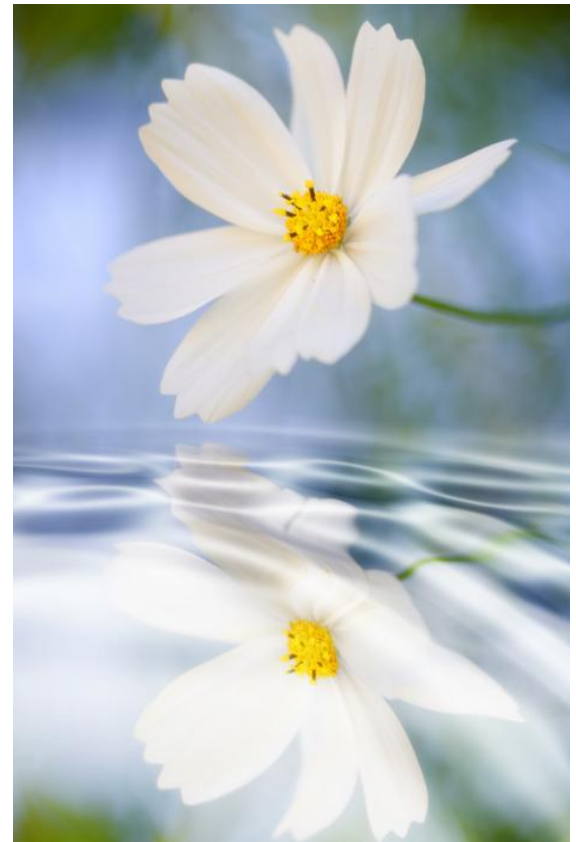
I was able to walk on the beam because my feet were steady.
